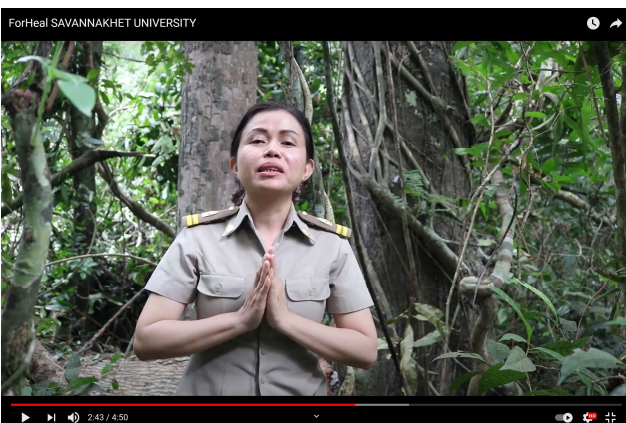




Erasmus+
